



Dare to Be (Holy) Spirit Led

*For as many as are led by the Spirit of God
these are sons of God. (Romans 8:14)*

Holy Spirit is the least understood of the Triune God. Father and Son are sought after, but Holy Spirit is often maligned as “something” not someone who produces bizarre manifestations. He is rarely sought after in terms of teaching and guidance for which He was given to us. More often than not, He is the invisible Man to the majority of Christians. Without The Spirit of Truth (another name for Him) leading us, we are led by all and sundry. Anyone can claim anything if there is no reference point, and although the Word is most Christians’ barometer of what is legitimate or not, interpretations on Scripture has brought brutal divisiveness into the Body of Christ. If Holy Spirit is as He is described in 1 John 2:27, the anointing that leads us into all truth and we therefore have no need that anyone teach us, perhaps we should consult Him on all things.

*"But the anointing which you have
Received from Him abides in you
And you do not need that anyone
Teach you; but as the same anointing
Teaches you concerning all things
And is true, and is not a lie,
Just as it has taught you, you
Will abide in Him" (1John 2:27)*

If Holy Spirit were given His due and yielded to, all undue pressure to perform, all works to show we are acceptable in God's sight and all need

to pressure others would be eliminated. When you become aware that you are so deeply approved of by God that He chose to dwell within you, those voices and pressures are silenced. So in actuality what does it mean to be Spirit led? It must be based on being yielded to Holy Spirit, this implies we trust Him, know His voice and follow His lead. How does such a relationship develop? In time, and not a long time, just takes some time. It is simpler than we have been led to believe, because He indwells us. To assist in the growth of your relationship with Holy Spirit, He has suggested the next section of this booklet be for you and Him alone....He has told me to make it in form of a journal/diary where you and He can discuss and commune together on how He is teaching, what you are learning and how you and He (as One) are touching others. To be Spirit led should not be only relegated to healing, or ministering, but to our entire lives.

There is no other way to have a relationship with someone, other than to relate. No matter how many books we may read on marriage, nothing is a substitute for having one and relating to our spouse. It is the same with Holy Spirit; there is no substitute for being with Him. So the adventure begins.....

My prayer for every believer reading this ...

Heavenly Father, you gave us Jesus and His Cross, and you then sent Your Spirit to dwell within us. What a privilege to be made One with You. As they journal with you and walk in Your presence fill them Holy Spirit with a tangible, undeniable knowing of You, all the days of their life in Jesus name! Hallelujah!

***At the end of the booklet are several articles He inspired me to write about Him, to enhance our understanding of Who this God is Who lives in us.

When you are going through this process do not let the enemy hijack you and distract you from the task at hand. Only one day at a time (don't look ahead to the next day's task) and do not let the enemy thwart you or discourage you. This is between you and the Living God, living in you. Just keep walking with Him; He leads, you follow. If you are undertaking this journey, know that it requires commitment; do not begin it and then lay it aside for you will not receive what He has planned for you in taking this adventure in Him.

Dare to Be Spirit Led

Intro ~

Since this may be a new experience for you, get introduced. This is His introduction. After reading, write your introduction to Him.

- **I AM a person.**
- **I am the presence of God on earth**
- **I am not confined**
- **I celebrate your victories with you**
- **I am not afraid to see/share your pain, for I am your Comforter**
- **I bring newness of life**
- **The dead to live**
- **I am not containable**
- **I am searchable for those who want to find**
- **I am not afraid or discouraged by your weakness or flaws**
- **I open doors you never knew were there**
- **I guide you even when you ignore Me (when you do ignore Me, we both miss the miracles and loved planned for you and others)**
- **I laugh with you and sometimes at you, but never at your expense**
- **I will always listen, never condemn and always be with you**
- **Your heart is my mission**
- **I never leave anything unfinished**
- **The truth I lead you into is LOVE**

So, in conclusion, if you ever desire to know Me, simply ask for My Presence to come upon you and be awakened within you and I will show you, great and mighty wonders you know not of.

Now it is your turn...

After introducing yourself (and don't think this is silly, He is listening because if you are born again, He is the indwelling Spirit). Re-read what you have said aloud to Him. He may smile (you may feel this), or He may give you a word, or encouragement. If you do not hear His voice at this time, remember it is only day 1.

Dare 1 ~ Just Ask (John 14:16-17, John 16:14, Romans 14:17)

Simply ask for Him to bring His presence upon you and awaken His presence within you. Then wait and let yourself sense Him...remember, no effort. You cannot make yourself 'feel' Him, you can only make yourself open. After a few minutes, write down what you sensed, don't judge it or think about all the things others have said about Him. Just write what He gave you personally. Choose a place you love being, because if you love it so will He; your special spot. If you do not have a special spot, ask Him where He would like to be with you.

Dare 2 ~ Open Discussion (John 14:26)

Again take yourself with Holy Spirit to your special spot, and ask Him to teach you something that is very important to you. This usually will be a series of revelations and lessons over a period of time. One of the most foundational questions we can ask Him is what it means that you were crucified with Christ, dead and buried and risen with Him. Without the Cross there is no Oneness with the Father. Ask Holy Spirit to explain this truth. You will never be the same. Write down anything He may have said initially and then continue to write down impressions, Scriptures, words, revelation that He gives over the course of time.

Dare 3 ~ Believe He is a Person (1John 2:27, John 14:16)

Begin to talk with and consider Him a person, not just a thing or force, or power. Ask Him anything that you desire to learn about and even for practical issues like how do I teach my child about you Lord? What do I say to my husband about our finances? How can I get my wife to understand the plans I have? Anything and everything He is an expert at...because He teaches us concerning **all things**. Write what He shared and taught you about any questions you asked Him.

Dare 4 ~ Serving Others (Psalm 37:23, Gal.5:25, John 15:12)

Holy Spirit leads us into all truth including who He has prepared to receive Him. You can simply ask as you begin your day, "Holy Spirit lead me to those who will receive Your power and healing and grace, and lead them to me, in Jesus name." This may mean a neighbor stops by and ends up crying at the kitchen table and you pray for them and lead them to salvation; or it may mean as you are grocery shopping or filling the tank with gas/fuel someone is limping and you simply ask them what has happened and after you chat you ask to pray and lay hands on them. He will guide you, your job is to listen. By the way, listening is not simply hearing in sentences a specific instruction; it is impressions about someone you notice, a picture, or a light around/above them or a word. He will communicate with you individually as to what suits your make-up and learning style. Sometimes He just surprises you and puts you in a place you didn't even expect ministering would occur. Write about whoever He led you to and share how He ministered to them with you. If you did not minister specifically to anyone share what impressions He gave you.

Dare 5 ~ Just be Yourself : He Knows You Anyway (Matt. 10:30, Matt. 5:8, John 16:13, John 15:7)

Some suggest that in order to commune with Holy Spirit we must be still and quiet and listen. This often degrades into Eastern-style meditation. How would you relate to your husband or wife or children or friends? Would you close your eyes and think what you want to speak to them or try and quiet what you have on your mind while they sat in front of you? Very unlikely. Holy Spirit is a Person. So to commune with Him successfully, it probably would be best to be yourself, tell Him what is on your mind and heart and share genuinely. After you finish, you will naturally quiet down because you have shared what you want to and then it is His turn. Sometimes He will interrupt to laugh at you (in a friendly way), or share His impressions on the matter, sometime He will wait and let you finish. He may even scold you; but if He does it is a chastening done in love, not condemnation. So today, be *yourself*, with Holy Spirit and go to that special spot, and *meditate* which in Hebrew actually means *to speak, complain, pray, commune and declare*. Yes, you have permission to complain (and no lightning strikes will be administered). Of course as we quiet down from sharing our hearts, His presence and voice is far more easily heard. So complain and pray and declare away; then write down anything He shared with you or how it felt to complain, declare, speak, pray, commune.

Dare 6 ~ To Know Him (Eph. 3:19)

In Ephesians 3:19 Paul writes: " ...to *know* the love of Christ that passes knowledge; that you may be filled with *all* the fullness of God." That word 'know' in Greek, means experiential knowing, intimate knowing as a husband and wife know each other as one. This is how we are to know God, this is why in Matthew 7:21, Jesus admonishes those that claim their reward because what they have done and He responds by telling them, he never knew them. Same "know" as in Ephesians. So knowing Him is paramount as far as His heart is concerned. And what does this knowing lead to? Being filled with *all* the fullness of God. There is no better prize. Today, ask Holy Spirit to teach how to know the love of Christ. Let Him show you in word or impression or feeling or picture, etc. Even ask Him to bring His presence upon you and awaken His presence within you in Jesus name. This is an ongoing relationship and we develop it daily. Write down what you received.

Dare 7 ~ Ask Holy Spirit {fellowship} 1Cor.13:14

Ask Him for what you really want in your relationship with God. Tell Him how you want it to be between you and Him. In detail.

After you have shared with Him, allow Him to share with you, His ideal of your relationship. You may find they have more in common than you think. Trust Him to speak to and through you. Write down what He has shared, even if you hear only a word.

Dare 8 ~ Seek His Clarity (James 1:5)

If there are any Scriptures, that you are confused about, seek His clarity. As you read them (even just one or two that are key verses for you). Ask for the Spirit of truth to reveal what He meant when He inspired those verses. Write down the verse(s) and what He tells you.

Dare 9 ~ Romance and Love (Rom. 5:5, Psalm 136, Rom. 8:38)

Holy Spirit is a hopeful romantic. He inspired the poetry of the Psalms and Song of Solomon. The Bible can be viewed as an instruction book or a love letter; it is in the eye of the beholder. One thing is for certain in His eyes you are worthy enough to sacrifice His only begotten Son, Jesus. Ask Holy Spirit how He sees you. He was willing to dwell in you, from the inside out, and sees everything (Omniscience tends to prevent secrets), including the things you are trying to hide. Since nothing separates us from the love of God, He can only see us through the eyes of Love. Let Him tell you what He thinks of the Bride of Christ (of which you are). Write down any impressions, thoughts, or words He may have given you.

Dare 10 ~ Help in Conflict (1John2:27)

Holy Spirit is an expert at all things, since He teaches us concerning all things. Conflict is an area we usually attempt to avoid, but as a Christian (let alone as a human being) we are promised it. As soon as we are born again, we have set a dividing line between us and the world. This will undoubtedly lead to conflicts; whether in family, work or just in general. Consider any current conflict in your life and ask Holy Spirit how to resolve it. Seek His help, for He is the Helper. It is not our job to figure everything out; it is our job to rely on the One who made us. You may receive an immediate solution (including a Scripture, picture or word/impression) or He may resolve it in real time. Simply invite Him into the situation and watch with wonder the Holy Spirit work all things together for the good of those who love Him (you). Write down any immediate response.

Dare 11 ~ Holy Spirit as Comforter (John 15:26)

There is a reason He is sent in the capacity as Comforter. Thus accommodation is for our benefit when we are faced with painful situations. Consider an uncomfortable situation. Invite Holy Spirit to comfort you about this (your emotions and thoughts). Since Holy Spirit can be very subtle in His approach, you may just notice over time (usually brief) that what was causing you discomfort, no longer disturbs you. Take the day to consider any difference you notice about the discomfort being lifted and write down your experience.

Dare 13 ~ Holy Spirit's Will (1Cor. 12:11)

He has a will. When our desires, (for instance for spiritual gifts) are shared with Him, His will is engaged. He is not a pick and choose type of God, "duck, duck, goose." This one gets a prize and this one does without. He has blessed us with all spiritual blessings in Christ Jesus. We seek and then find, we knock and the door is opened, we ask and then receive. So ask, seek and knock. Write what spiritual gift or gifts you desire and why (motivation). Be honest; our hearts determine His will in these matters.

Dare 14 ~ His Wisdom {not ours}

(Isa. 11:2, Pro. 2:6, Jn 14:26, James 1:5, 1Cor. 1:26, 1Cor. 2:13)

Proverbs is filled with admonition and advice about His wisdom. Holy Spirit is the source of wisdom, the Spirit of Truth, Himself. Our wisdom is foolishness to God, with this in mind, deferring to Holy Spirit the One who is the source of wisdom living in us, in all situations seems wise. Ask Him to give you wisdom in a situation where it seems to be lacking. Just talk to Him about it and then let Him share His wisdom. Don't expect that this wisdom comes necessarily as a linear thought or in a particular way. He sometimes just fluidly thinks with us, for we are one with Him. Write what He shared.

Dare 15 ~ Don't Resist (1Cor.2:10-12, Acts 21:4 Acts 21:11)

As you spend time with Holy Spirit, you will notice and sense His presence. He is a person and has a sense of humor, especially as it pertains to you. He finds us funny, at times even entertaining. He knows everything about you, even what you don't want Him to know. He will remind you of instructions He has formerly given if you don't heed the first time. He tends to be relentless, so yielding is the most sensible choice. Think of a time you resisted His instructions (no condemnation here; remember there is none in Christ Jesus). Or if you can't remember ask Him to remind you and discuss openly why you resisted. Tell Him whether you are willing to submit now or not. It is a choice not a dictatorship. Write down what you resisted, why and what you plan to do.

Dare 16 ~ Grieving Holy Spirit (Gen. 6:6, Isa. 63:10, Eph. 4:29-32,)

Holy Spirit can be grieved. We have all heard this comment and usually have become worried by instructions from others that our behavior or choices are grieving Him; we often expect punishment as a result. But punishment was taken by our dear Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. And chastening of His sons is not punishment but correction. Grieving refers to making one sad. How do we bring sadness to Holy Spirit? How do we bring sadness to others? If we hold to bitterness, anger, strife, slander, it affects Holy Spirit, because He lives in us. He is not an unfeeling automaton. He is the same Spirit that not only raised Jesus from the dead but created all life, is the source of wisdom and miraculous power, and all Truth. So, if we are in strife or hatred this effects how we see and interact and also effects how He flows through us. Not that it effects His righteousness, anymore than it effects ours, for we are redeemed by the blood of the Lamb (we are the righteousness of God in Christ Jesus). But it affects our attitude, outlook and interactions; it effects our relationship with Him. We are not to be vigilant, alert , concerned with every move we make and try to discern whether it grieved Him or not. We are to bring the things that have upset us, even injustice done to us, those things that disturb us to Holy Spirit (our Comforter/Helper), not bear them upon our own shoulders. This is what causes the bitterness to take up residence, then anger turns to malice and hurt turns to unforgiveness. When forgiveness is impossible for us, we can ask Holy Spirit to forgive the violation through us for we have Christ in us, the One who forgave all in all; but forgiveness is not a decision or psychological choice; it is supernatural. We do the asking, Holy Spirit does the forgiving in and through us.

What is the greatest grief (sadness) we can produce in Holy Spirit? Being thoroughly ignored, denied as being a part of our lives, avoided for fear of seduction. Not that He sulks somewhere because of our ignorance, but we are His temple. A temple , that knows not its purpose, power and what it contains, unused---a waste. In the Greek, grieving means to make sad or bring sorrow. How amazing to consider God in us could be made sad by our choices and attitudes. That is intimacy. For He so loved us that He gave (not just sent), gave Jesus. Ask Him how you may have grieved Him (if you already know share openly with Him). He does not hold this against you and this is not to stir up guilt. This is to help you realize that's how much He cares for you, that you could even make Him sad. Write down your and His responses.

Dare 17 ~ Trust (1John3:24, Romans 8:16, 1John2:20, 1John 4:2)

Trusting Holy Spirit is a process, not because of His character but often because what we have been warned to believe. He is not an uncontrolled, wispy spirit who encourages outrageous or strange manifestation. He is a Person, Holy Spirit. Many have forewarned the Church to have nothing to do with Him other than hope He illuminates Scripture during Bible study...we are warned not to talk with Him, for fear we may be speaking to a seducing spirit, but He abides in us and the Spirit signifies that we are sons of God. We are instructed to test every spirit, (and the test is very clear cut and simple in 1John 4:2, but we are not to avoid Holy Spirit. He spoke to Paul and the other apostles and not just regarding what to include in the Scriptures but for their personal safety, direction and circumstances. Holy Spirit is still alive today, in us. He can and will directs us if He is invited. Trust develops as you become familiar with Him. Think of how trust grows in any relationship. Being honest and open is the foundation for trust. This includes being honest and open with Holy Spirit. We often avoid what is uncomfortable (openness), but remember He is our Comforter; so He will attend to that as you share. Tell Him your dreams, hopes, visions, even disappointments as you would with a dear friend. He always listens, because He is in you, One. Write down anything in particular that you shared and that helped build trust with Him.

Dare 18 ~ Fear of the Lord (Psalm 25:12, Psalm 34:4,7,11, Psalm 19:9)

Holy Spirit lives within us, but that is not His only place of residence. He existed for eternity, omniscient, omnipotent, omnipresent. He is the power of God; the Person of that power, Holy Spirit. As we grow intimate, there is also a balance necessary, not to turn Him into a *cute teddy bear, a little buddy or gushy guy*. That would be similar to squishing a nuclear arsenal and stroking the warheads. Our intimacy with Holy Spirit is through awe, wonder and the Love of the Father that sent Him, not patronizing familiarity. The fear He mentions in Scriptures leads to our protection; that is the extent of His love. Ask Him to teach you what it means to have the fear of the Lord. If He reveals it throughout the day write down those revelations.

Dare 19 ~ Honor the Spirit (1Cor 2:13-14, Jn 16:8)

Holy Spirit is not a toy, nor puppy dog following behind us "confirming the WORD" , nor a machine. Some have relegated Him to a position of their personal "power-pack", on-tap at any given moment. He is God in us, One with us. We are containers, vessels of His very presence/power and temples of His Spirit. This is to be regarded with the utmost honor, not flippantly brag about or demean. Ask Holy Spirit how to honor Him. He may give very simple answers (e.g. "Listen to what I say.") Write down what He shares with you.

Dare 20 ~ His Voice (Isa. 6:8, Isa. 30:21, Jn 14:16, Jn 16:13, Acts 13:2-4, 1 Cor.2:14-15, 1Cor.12:13)

How do we recognize His voice as distinct from other spirits and teachings. We are told He will never contradict the Scriptures and of course this is true. Often Scriptures are twisted to prove we are not to listen to Holy Spirit under the guise that we are to only listen to His Son. Well, who prayed for Him to take His place? Who sent Him in Jesus' stead. We need to rightly divide the Word. How do we rightly divide the Word? By the Spirit of Truth. Who is the Spirit of Truth? Holy Spirit. They work in unity, never apart...the letter kills but the Spirit adds life. The Spirit always confirms the Word. We have straight-jacketed Him by the very Word of God, He inspired. To assume that it is too dangerous to speak to Him and listen to His responses, for fear we may be seduced, leaves us vulnerable to spiritual seduction, because without the Spirit of Truth who are we listening to? Ask Him to teach you to recognize His voice. His speaking to people hasn't finished with the prophets of the Old Testament nor the apostles of the New Testament. He abides in us forever.

Dare 21 ~ Take Him off the Leash (IJohn2:27, Rom. 14:17, Rom.15:13 1Cor.2:13)

This is the final dare. Take Him off the leash, out of the locked up traditional box that has grown around Him. He will not lead you into lunacy or licentiousness. He will lead you into all truth. Just declare aloud: "Holy Spirit I take You off the leash in Jesus name and let You have free reign in my life, for You are the Spirit of truth and I will trust You." If after praying this, He speaks to you or gives you a thought, understanding, picture, etc. write it down. If not just know you have unleashed the power of the Living God in you to be free to reign in your life through Jesus Christ our Lord, Amen.

Being Spirit Led is Not for Wimps ~

A God that is all powerful, all knowing and always present is not a weak, fluffy or flimsy God to be led by. Although, being led by the Spirit has become synonymous with an excuse for Christian complacency or cowardice; or an excuse to act like a lunatic by one's own choosing, genuine Spiritual leading, could not be further from the truth. Why? Simply, because it means being totally surrendered to the Living God living in us...Holy Spirit. It signifies that we actually trust God and prefer His will to our own. And if we make a mistake, when we think we hear His voice or leading, His grace is sufficient. That is good news. In the Book of Acts and many of the letters of Paul, the Holy Spirit was acknowledged in leading, directing and correcting. No one was ashamed to call on, or inquire of Him. He even inspired the writing that we read today as the New Testament, let alone the old. Unfortunately, the Bible has become a substitute for Him rather than an expression of His will and wisdom. After all He is the Author of the Book so He may just know how to interpret what He meant.

Being Spirit led has been relegated to some obscure corner of Christendom, for those on the edge, for the unreliable or flaky. Circus acts and demonstrations of ribald hysterics was never, and never will be HIM. He is the Person, the Power of God, God Himself who can transform a man's heart in an instant, heal a dying person in the same time and fill a man with joy unspeakable; let alone bring one to total union with God, for He is that union. In reality being led by His Spirit is the sanest choice we can make. The difficulty for most Christians is they don't know how. They are ignorant of His Presence, voice, attributes and leanings. They have never been taught. Most likely they have been instructed to never follow the voice that calls to them and leaves a sense or impression, because who knows it could be the voice of the devil...Interestingly, who might be telling you such a bunch of codswollip (a.k.a. garbage)..Yes the one who only lies, satan. The devil warns you not to trust the Holy Spirit because you might just be tuning into the wrong frequency and find his(satan) voice instead; and yet it is his voice that is warning you not to talk to the Holy Spirit...hmmm spiritual catch22. Of course, such a warning is usually enough to terrify any good Bible-believing, believer into tuning out, not in, to the Spirit of God.

In the book of Acts the apostles were not timid or ignorant in relating to Holy Spirit, that is how Pentecost came about, how they chose the replacement for Judas, how Philip was transported to the Ethiopian eunuch, Paul given restored sight by Annaias

and how Peter was instructed to minister to the gentiles (Cornelius' entire household coming to Christ), and all leaders were selected and called. So who is this Spirit that we have been taught to ignore at our and the world's peril?

- Acts as the Spirit of Wisdom (Isaiah 11:2, 40:13-14)
- He convicts (believers of righteousness)/unbelievers of sin (Jn 16:8)
- He guides where to preach and to whom (Acts 8:29, 10:19,20 16:6-7)
- He was sent by Christ from the Father (Jn 15:26)
- He dwells in us forever (Jn 14:16) therefore He will never leave us nor forsake us

The preceding list of His attributes and abilities is only partial. If indeed, Holy Spirit is the One whom proceeded from Father and came in Jesus' stead, might it not be wise to consider becoming acquainted with Him at least and intimate, at best. Being Led by Holy Spirit means we have to admit, everything is not all in our control (but the One in control is ONE with us) and that the Father Himself is still on the throne; that takes courage not cowardice to confess.

If we ask Holy Spirit to teach us about Himself, He will gladly accommodate. He leads us into all truth and He cannot lie, and that includes everything, even about Himself. (1John 2:27)

Fullness of God

If we deny a living relationship with Holy Spirit, we will live as orphans might, still pleading with God for understanding, closeness and unity ("Father do you hear me?" type of scenario). Not realizing it is impossible for Him not to hear as His very Spirit lives in us ~ the fullness of God. As believers we are not to camp on one aspect of God (Elohim), i.e.: His grace, His forgiveness, His peace, His authority, His healing/miracles, His power; this eventuates into factions, tribes, cliques, which of course evolves into division. He sent Jesus to give us fullness in Him; full forgiveness, full perfection, full power, full righteousness, etc. FULLNESS...How do we experience this fullness? Would you say: "Just repeat this Scripture, 3 times a day: 'I am the Righteousness of God in Christ Jesus and call me in the morning'? No! The Spirit adds life to the Word and without relationship with Him we might as well be practicing positive mental attitude (affirmations).

The truth is we ourselves are infused with His fullness through the indwelling Spirit. It is a nearly unbelievable reality, but nonetheless, true. We must refuse to be ashamed of our relationship with Holy Spirit; refuse to be swayed from growing closer. Holy Spirit is the union that Jesus bought on the Cross. If we are ashamed of Holy Spirit and attempt to limit His working in ourselves or others, are we then ashamed of the Blood and the Cross? Life with God, union with Him did not stop at the Cross it began there, and relationship with Holy Spirit brings us the fullness of God. We cannot control the Holy Spirit with intellect, nor reasoning; for how does one decipher the Omnipotent, Omnipresent, and Omniscient with human wisdom? It is the Love of the Father that sends us Holy Spirit (a Person) to indwell and empower, to be in us forever and not just when required at a Bible study or during song service, but at every moment of everyday. His attention is ours.

Our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit, as if we are the Tabernacle of meeting in the desert, wherein the Holy of Holies was filled with His glory. There is no separation in Him. From the "I AM" of Moses to the Fire of Pentecost, ALL ONE. Although Elohim (Father, Son , Holy Spirit) is 3 Persons, He is not separate from Himself; only at the Cross did separation ever occur when Jesus became our sin personified. This revelation caused me to fall in Love with this God of the Universe as I knew I no longer needed to seek God

I had found Him; for who else would have separated Himself from Himself for me? When someone is offended and accuses another of having too much emphasis on Holy Spirit, it is the same as the Pharisees being offended when Jesus said I AM. He abides in me and I abide in Him. We are One...never orphans...We need only ask Holy Spirit to teach us anything and all things and He will more than accommodate. He is living, real and a Person waiting for us.....to be real with Him.

What's so bad about Holy Spirit? Well.....

Once we commune with and know Him, listen and allow Him to lead us into all truth, no one can trick us and that ruins the enemy's schemes for life! The enemy is more threatened by your relationship with Holy Spirit than your relationship with Jesus...why? Because you believe in Jesus as Your savior and remain defeated for life here on earth. But if you have a personal relationship with Holy Spirit, the enemy is doomed. He offers discernment, guidance, encouragement and truth every step of the way. So if you become snagged in a lie or deception and you seek His help; that lie or deception of even wrong direction will be quickly resolved and attended too. Jesus said it was better for Him to leave so we could receive, Him, Holy Spirit within us not just with us.

The Holy Spirit is a gift from the Father, so should we not accept this gift.....? The Father only gives good gifts. Why is Holy Spirit, who proceeded from the Father, the one gift that is mistrusted the most in Christendom? Is HE not worthy of being trusted? Did not the early Church trust Him with their lives, their direction, their very words? Why is He in modern Christianity viewed with suspicion? One very likely possibility is that if believers have a genuine relationship with Holy Spirit, then others cannot control them. Some are so offended by teachings that enable and equip believers to have relationship with Him, it becomes a rigid doctrinal position, that we must not glorify Him or focus too much on Him. Perhaps it isn't that they are worried He is being glorified, but they are worried they will no longer be glorified by those they teach, have authority over or control. Although, this is a harsh statement and it grieves my heart to speak it, why else such resistance to Holy Spirit actually being engaged as the abiding presence in every area of our lives?

I have been told relying on Holy Spirit will put you at risk of seducing spirits and maybe you are not hearing from Holy Ghost at all. Reading only the Word of God and never communing (or only communing on our terms) with the Spirit to illuminate the Word will lead to the same scenario. How do we rightly divide the Word? Answer: By the Spirit of Truth. Who is the Spirit of Truth? Answer: Holy Spirit. They work in unity, never apart...the letter kills but the Spirit adds life. We are to walk in the newness of the Spirit not in the oldness of the letter. If we walk in the Spirit we are under grace and He promises that when we walk in the Spirit, we will not fulfill the lusts of the flesh. Without Him we are blind for He is TRUTH and He came to replace Jesus as the Son of God foertold that the Father would sent the indwelling Spirit Himself to abide in us forever and teach us concerning all things. If someone is that concerned about being deceived, they can ask for discernment and who gives that gift, yes Holy Spirit...if we are going to be

suspicious of Him in one area well how can we trust Him in any. He gives the nine spiritual gifts, we could just as easily suspect those...is this really the gift of healing, we could imagine it to be a counterfeit. This leads to an endless trail of suspicion and doubt/worry...or we can simply trust the Spirit of the Living God and know we are covered by His grace, when we mistake His voice or His direction. But to assume that it is too dangerous to speak avidly of Him and to Him and defer to Him, for fear we may be seduced leaves us vulnerable to spiritual seduction, because without the Spirit of Truth who are we listening to? He is not someone to use Scripture to avoid(e.g. "well Holy Spirit is only allowed to point to Jesus and He only brings to remembrance what Jesus said"....wait a minute, it does not say 'only' (only is implied). Everything Holy Spirit, the Person of God does, He does glorifies Jesus and without Him, we cannot glorify the One who saved us. They are ONE, not in competition. They are supernatural, not human and limited by human frailties like jealousy and strife.

Holy Spirit will guide our every step, in fact that is what He is meant to do...ordered steps. We need only heed to His voice and presence. And how can we if we are told to ignore Him? Holy Spirit can wake us up in the night and gives us spiritual gifts, or calls us to pray for someone in distress, He reveals prophesy for others and Words of Wisdom/Knowledge and more than that HE communes when you are quiet in the middle of the night reminding you how precious you are to the Father and how loved you are or He may even drench you with His presence....so many, many benefits Holy Spirit offers.He is the SPirit of Truth Himself indwelling us; and therefore, He only leads us into truth. In the early Church, He chose ministers and directed Apostles, what to preach and where....does He not do the same today? He indwells us forever Jesus said. He sanctifies us, Comforts us, Helps us and often laughs with us and at us. If fear that will be deceived by other spirits is a concern isn't the most reasonable option, to become intimate with the Holy Spirit, as that will prevent any successful deception. Relegating Him to the "he only points to Jesus so don't worry about Him" mode has cheated the Body of Christ of the Living truth, living in them..It's time to set the captives free, including Holy Spirit!

Holy Ghost we loose you from the bondage of human limitation (in ourselves) and let you have free reign for His kingdom come on earth as it is in heaven, in Jesus name. to do and to will for Your good pleasure....
